Directors comments:

For the CWSRF Construction application for the WWTP Improvement Project, State has completed their review of the General, Technical, and Financial Packages. The complete application is being routed through Division of Financial Assistance's upper management for review and approval of a funding agreement. Receiving upper management's approval is currently the only remaining item for the application. I contacted the Project Manager Gabriel Berzamina yesterday, and he said that there have been no decisions yet and unfortunately, he does not have a time estimate for when we may receive a decision. Once upper management has given their approval, the application will be deemed complete and the Division of Financial Assistance will draft the funding agreement, which is now taking 3-4 months to complete.

Oct 22: Veronica Martinez from LA that works from Federal Census 2020 called me to ask about the difference work in Rural areas and big cities, what are the feelings from our communities and if I heard some Negatives or positives comments, I answered a lot of people doesn't know what Census mean and though it's only for US Citizen

Oct 23: Bill came to warn us about the low fluent level on our WWTP, I drove around to see if everything was ok, later he came and said the problem it's located on 3rd Street, they fixed the problem the same day.

Oct 24: I assisted to General Manager training in Sacramento, they show us the difference between a Water District managed from a Board or the County, due to differences of Boards members,

Oct 31: Shaw Market Engineer came to show us the Gas Station plans and asked us about Biola Basin located on B Street and said that county didn't let him to make his own basin next to Gas station due to environment bans and he has to connect to our basin, we lead him to our Engineer Gary horn to answer these questions; Gary called me and said it's not a problem;, next step is take Gas Station plans to Fresno County for Construction approval.

Oct 31: Korenia from CA State Water Department sent me an email saying that The Amendment for Biola Community Services District Funding Agreement – Contract No. D16-04001 was executed on October 29, 2019.

Nov.5: Gary and me met with Adam and Gary Serrato from FID to see about water agreement, they told us it's nothing yet until June or July but we can proceed with the recharge project and the Basin expansion and the connection between Shaw canal and

Basin also they add that they will shut of water at the mid of November and reopen on February 20

Nov 5: We sent an invoice to CA State water Board for Grant management, we are asking for some time that staff from BCSD office spent, since 2016 we are waiting for response

November 12: Fresno State called me to see if we want apply for a Generator and or batteries for our Hall, due to future PG&E electrical shut off, the maximum amount is \$100,000, I sent the requested information to them (Fresno State)
