2nd Phase

Jakara Movement's ongoing efforts to support community health and safety.

As part of the Jakara Movement's ongoing efforts to support community health and safety, we are collaborating with Valley Seed on a new project in the Biola area. Both Organizations have had great conversations around and looking at transforming some brown fields in the town of Biola. A needs assessment has been conducted with the community and some of the goals of this project have been identified. Since the community has expressed the lack of a green space, such as a park. The Jakara Movement has identified a few lots to test and transform, two of these lots are owned by the Biola Community Services District. We are requesting access to two lots within this area to conduct toxicity testing. Please be assured that the Biola District will not incur any costs associated with this testing. Additionally, the testing process will be carried out in a manner that ensures no disruption or alteration to the properties in question.
