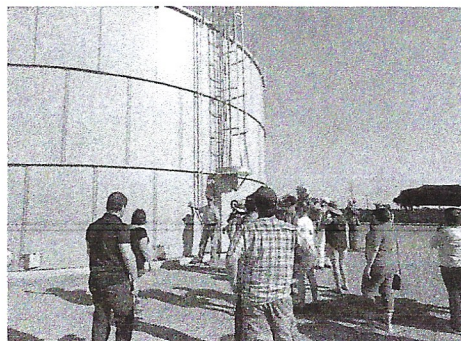
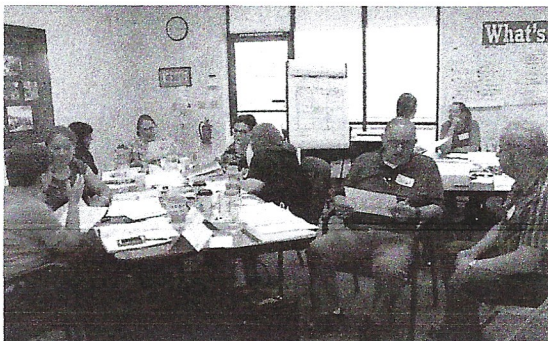

Why Participate:

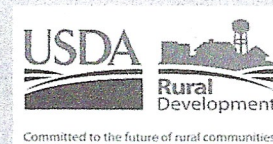
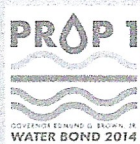
